# Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR)

Adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on 10th December 1948, the UDHR contains 30 Articles defining the fundamental human rights to be universally protected.

## LIST OF ALL 30 ARTICLES OF THE UDHR

- Right to Equality and Freedom – All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights.
- Freedom from Discrimination – No discrimination based on race, color, sex, language, religion, etc.
- Right to Life, Liberty, and Security.
- Prohibition of Slavery – No one shall be held in slavery or servitude.
- Freedom from Torture – No one shall be subjected to torture or cruel treatment or punishment.
- Recognition before the Law – Everyone has the right to be recognized as a person before the law.
- Equality before the Law – Equal protection of the law without discrimination.
- Right to Legal Remedy – Right to seek justice if one's rights are violated.
- Freedom from Arbitrary Arrest or Exile.
- Right to a Fair Public Hearing – Equal right to be heard in a competent and impartial tribunal.
- Presumption of Innocence – Everyone is considered innocent until proven guilty.
- Right to Privacy – Protection against arbitrary interference with privacy, family, or correspondence.
- Freedom of Movement – Right to move freely within and outside one's country.
- Right to Asylum – Right to seek asylum from persecution in other countries.
- Right to Nationality – Right to have and change nationality.
- Right to Marriage and Family – Freedom to marry and found a family without restriction.
- Right to Own Property – Right to own property alone or in association with others.
- Freedom of Thought, Conscience, and Religion.
- Freedom of Opinion and Expression.
- Right to Peaceful Assembly and Association.
- Right to Participate in Government – Right to vote and stand in elections.
- Right to Social Security – Access to education, healthcare, and employment.
- Right to Work – Just wages, favorable work conditions, and to form trade unions.
- Right to Rest and Leisure – Reasonable working hours and paid holidays.
- Right to Adequate Living Standards – Right to food, clothing, housing, and medical care.
- Right to Education – Free and compulsory elementary education.
- Right to Participate in Cultural Life – Access to arts, science, and cultural life.
- Right to a Free and Fair Social Order – An environment where rights can be fully realized.
- Duties to the Community – Respect for others' rights and freedoms.
- No Abuse of Rights – No one has the right to destroy the rights and freedoms set forth in this declaration.
